REGULATIONS FOR THE SHOW

- Entries must be made in writing to the Secretary, no later than 2nd July 2023. Should the
 secretary be able to take an entry after this date but before the catalogue is compiled, the
 entry fee will be double the normal rate. Membership of Wigtown Agricultural Society is
 required to enter any class in this Premium List (except Crooks & Walking sticks section).
- 2. When entering pedigree cattle and horses, exhibitors should state the name of animal, sire and dam. The ages of animals are to be reckoned according to the Rules and Regulations of the Herd Book or Stud Book applicable to the particular class.
- 3. Stock of all kinds exhibited for Premiums must have been bona fide the property, and in the possession, of the competitor or exhibitor at 2nd July 2023. In the Light Horse foal classes, the progeny need not be the property of the exhibitor if the same have been foaled in the district. All classes are open to all stock, with the exception of Young Farmers Classes which are confined stock within Wigtownshire and other classes where stated otherwise.
- No animal can be entered in more than one class, except for special prizes, group classes or where otherwise stated.
- 5. Only animals entered in a class can be judged for championships, cups, special prizes etc.
- All stock must be in the showground before 9.00a.m. and the party in charge of the stock must have the admission band admitting them. No animal will be admitted without the required paperwork.
- Anyone found to have tampered with or caused any pain or discomfort to their stock, will be
 disqualified and any prize money will be withdrawn. The Society reserves the right to have all
 animals inspected by the Official Veterinary Surgeons either prior to or after judging.
- 8. Unfit or pregnant animals, in last 10% gestation or one week after giving birth, must not be transported to the show.
- 9. All bulls above six months old must be led by nose ring/humbugs and halter and handler must be at least 16 years of age. All other cattle should be halter led (except commercial beef cow with calf at foot class for which pens will be provided).
- 10. Exhibitors are responsible for complying to all Animal Health & SGRPID regulations for shows and sales. The Society will not be liable for any rules not adhered to.
- Exhibitors should ensure that they have Public Liability Insurance in place to attend the show.
- 12. Judging of most sections commences at 9.00a.m. prompt. However, the Light Horse Ridden section will begin at 8.30am. Sheep sections start at 9.30a.m. and the Goat section starts at 10.00a.m. All animals will be judged in the rotation of their catalogue numbers and must be brought punctually into the judging ring when required, otherwise they shall be disqualified. The responsibility of getting stock into the ring as required by the judges' rests entirely with the exhibitor.

- 13. No premiums shall be awarded in any of the classes unless the exhibit is considered by the judge to be worthy of it.
- 14. All First, Second & Third prize-winning animals, which can be led, MUST appear in the Parade of Prize Livestock.
- 15. No stock shall leave the showground until 3 p.m. Should any livestock exhibitor also be showing poultry, please be aware that NO birds can be removed prior to 4.30pm. If you require to take other livestock home prior to this, please arrange for someone else to collect your birds at 4.30pm.
- 16. For the Supreme Championship of any Breed only the animal which takes the first prize in the male and female sections respectively shall be considered. On the Supreme Champion being chosen from these animals the Reserve in the section from which the Supreme Champion was chosen shall compete with the first animal remaining for the Reserve Supreme Championship. For Championships other than Supreme Championships of any breed, only animals which have taken an individual first prize shall be considered. On the Champion being chosen from these animals, the second prize-winner in the class from which the Champion has been selected shall compete with the first animal remaining for the Reserve Championship. (Champion Pair competing in the Grange of Bladnoch Trophy are not eligible for Champion of Champions)
- 17. Protests must be intimated to the Secretary before 1.30 p.m. on the day of the Show, and shall be accompanied by a deposit of £50 which shall, unless the Committee think otherwise, be forfeited to the Society in the event of the protest not being successful.
- 18. The Society will not be liable for any loss, injury or damage which stock or other exhibits, or individuals may sustain at the Show or whilst in the show field or car park, or damage to cars in the show field or car park.
- An exhibitor holding a trophy in their possession will be responsible for insuring the trophy, in the event of loss, theft or damage.
- The society retains the right to amalgamate classes/sections where there are insufficient entries.
- 21. Infringement of any of the foregoing Rules will in each case involve forfeiture of the prize.

MEMORANDUM FOR JUDGES

- 1. No judge is permitted to officiate in any Class in which to his knowledge any stock is competing of which he is the breeder, or in which he has at the date of the Show, or to his knowledge within 12 months previous thereto, had any property interest, or which to his knowledge has within said period passed through his hands as a purchaser or seller, or as an agent for any purchaser or seller.
- 2. Judges shall not award a Prize to any animal they deem to be unsound and should they be in doubt as to the soundness of a particular animal to which they propose to award a Prize, they shall call in the Society's Veterinary Surgeons to decide the question of soundness and their decision shall be final.


